Easing of lockdown restrictions. As you will be aware, some restrictions are changing from May 17th. This is a note about how this pertains to church:

All infection control measures (masks, social distancing, hand sanitising) remain the same for now. The choir have returned to sing during Sunday Mass, but congregational singing is still not permitted. The Peace will remain a noncontact greeting, and we will continue to receive Communion in the pews. The changes to indoor socialising do not have much application to church because of the number of people present at a church service; therefore, please can we continue to chat outside rather than indoors; outdoors, people can now gather in a group of up to 30 and therefore chatting after the service, for those that wish, can happen more easily.

Please continue to observe social distancing both inside and outside the building, and please continue to wear a mask inside the building (unless medically exempt) - not only at services, but whenever you are in the building with someone else who is not from the same household.

We are making preparations to allow us to move towards, we hope, a more 'normal' church life. This will be a gradual and evolving process, the speed of which will depend upon both the timing of the necessary Government and Church of England guidance, and the time we need to be able to organise resources needed to change and re-start different activities.

During the journey out of lockdown, it is important that we commit to making this journey in a unified way as a community. Whether we have been vaccinated or not, had Covid-19 or not, are looking forward to the lowering of restrictions or are anxious about it, we need to take the same precautions when we gather in church, and in doing so, ensure that we are caring for one another.

We are looking for more people to help with the floral displays in church. Arrangements are renewed approximately every three weeks with occasional extras for the special celebrations in the church's calendar. From Keith and Beryl Sharp: Thank you to everyone who has collected aluminium foil and cans for sale in aid of St Francis Hospice. The amount paid for aluminium is now so low that it took 8 years to raise £125. We have decided to stop collecting from now on, and once again thank you for your support over the years. (We will accept any foil you may have saved so far).

A message from the Christian charity working with the homeless and formerly known as Hope4Havering - Hope4Havering has undergone a change of name. This is because we are now reaching out into different areas, alongside Havering. We are now called Ahava Community. Ahava is a Hebrew word which means the feeling of intense longing for a person or place. It is a word which is translated "love" but is an active verb implying a generous, giving love. Our mission to the homeless is undiminished, although, due to Covid-19 restrictions, we are currently unable to run our Catalyst Night Shelter. We are very involved with over 50 people who are in our Thrive supported living studio flats across the borough. Since vacating Sennen Cottage, we are actively seeking a property to continue the Transformations Programme which was run from there. We now have 3 shops and a café operating in Romford. Two of the shops are in Atlanta Boulevard and one is in the Brewery Car Park. The Café is in the Market Place but also has dresses for sale.
