
Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14, 2:18-23

Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity. I, the Teacher, when king over Israel in Jerusalem, applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to human beings to be busy with. I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun; and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to those who come after me- and who knows whether they will be wise or foolish? Yet they will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. So I turned and gave my heart up to despair concerning all the toil of my labours under the sun, because sometimes one who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave all to be enjoyed by another who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. What do mortals get from all the toil and strain with which they toil under the sun? For all their days are full of pain,

and their work is a vexation; even at night their minds do not rest. This also is vanity.

Responsorial Psalm 49



For no one can indeed ransom another or pay to God the price of deliverance. To ransom a soul is too costly; there is no price one could pay for it, so that they might live for ever, and never see the grave.

For we see that the wise die also; with the foolish and ignorant they perish and leave their riches to others.

Their tomb is their home for ever, their dwelling through all generations, though they call their lands after their own names. Those who have honour, but lack understanding, are like the beasts that perish.

Colossians 3:1-11

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things - anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me.' But he said to him, 'Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?' And he said to the crowd, 'Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' Then he told them a parable: 'The land of a rich man produced abundantly. And he thought to himself, "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?" Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.'" But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God.'

MSF is an international humanitarian organisation providing medical care in more than 70 countries. Since 1971, they have been treating people caught in complex crises and chronic healthcare emergencies



around the world. From their paediatric nurses to their off-road drivers, they are experts at working in fast-moving and highly-insecure environments. So, whether it's launching a rapid response or delivering community care, they go wherever they are needed most.

In 2023, they admitted more than 1.3 million people to their hospitals and held more than 16.4 million consultations, including at mobile clinics and in refugee camps.

Their vital work often hits the headlines when there's an emergency such as an earthquake, war or disease outbreak. However, their teams are also running long-term medical programmes for vulnerable groups cut off from care, or speaking out about unseen suffering and the policies that cause it. Around the world, 365 days a year, they are there even when the cameras are not.

A message from Revd Nicky Teverson: Eight years ago I spent six months at St Laurence and during this time I set up a charity to build an orphanage in Njombe, Tanzania. The challenges the board of trustees and I have overcome have been immense - corruption, covid and bureaucratic redtape - the whole process has demanded tenacity, prayer, resilience and determination. Now after six years of construction and two waiting for the official licence, we are able to open our doors to provide a loving and caring home for children who have nothing. To this end, three Sisters, trained in childcare, from the convent where the home is built will care for the children. We have gardens planted with vegetables and fruit and some cows will be arriving soon. The children will arrive in the next few weeks and we continue to raise funds to provide food, clothes and education for them. We will soon be reaching out to people to 'sponsor a child'.
